Mayor Glenn Wunderlich presided.

Mayor Wunderlich brought the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

1. Mayor Wunderlich led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Public Comment. Superintendent Josh Reed gave a report on what is happening at the school for the summer. Zac Beaudry voiced his displeasure on people not coming to him personally to talk to him about his junk/vehicles instead of having law enforcement come to his door.

3. Law Enforcement Report. Sheriff Skorupa gave a brief police report.

4. Library Report.
Tawnee Hartwell gave the library report.

5. Public Works Report. Josh Clifford gave the water report. The Town pumped 2,910,600 gallons of water for the month, for an average of 93,890 gallons per day. Bulk water sold 104,600 gallons for month. The water sample was good for the month. The water levels in the wells are about average for this time of year.

6. Ordinance #206 Title 5 Chapter3 Animal Control: The council had a brief discussion and decided to table ordinance #206 until they could get more input from the community. They thought it would be a good idea to send out a survey for the extra input. - Mayor Wunderlich called for a motion to table ordinance #206. Alderwoman Hartwell made a motion to table the ordinance. Alderman Cannady second. Mayor Wunderlich called for a vote on the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

7. Consent Items

4. School District 18-801 Choteau Ave. submitted a building permit to put in another schoolhouse.
